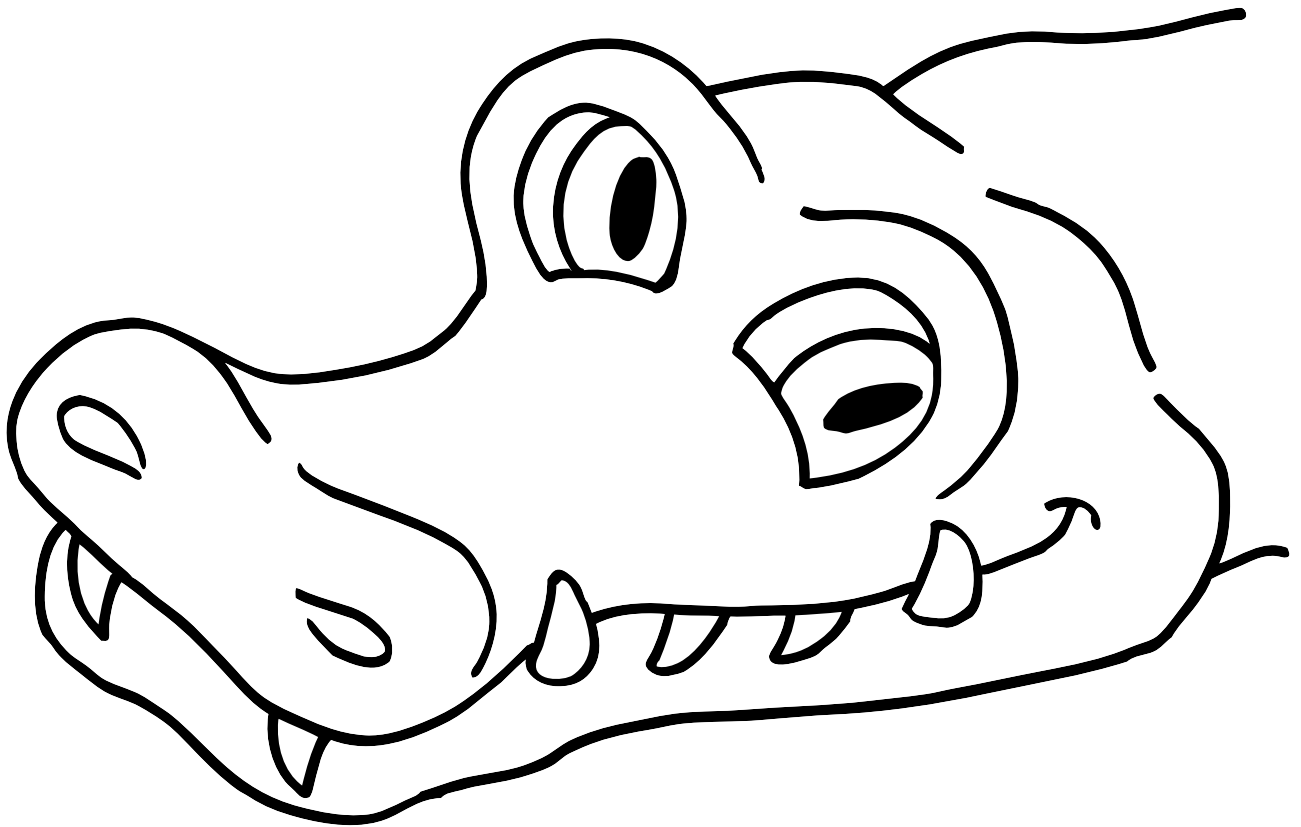


DRAWING ASSIGNMENT

WEEK TWO

DUE WEEK OF OCTOBER 24TH

Turn your sketchpad sideways. The alligator should take up most of the page. When drawing an animal, always start with the eyes or the nose. In this case, we'll start with the left eye. Find the middle of the page. Jump up a little. Draw the left eye, coloring in the inner circle black with pencil. The right eye is tilted down, curving around to the side. Draw the right eye, coloring the inner circle black with pencil. Draw the eyebrow ridge above the right eye. Draw the eyebrow ridge above the left eye, continuing down and over to the left to start the nose. Draw the nose which also tilts down to the right. Add the two nostril holes. Draw the two lines above the nostril holes. Draw the two fangs below the nostril holes. Now we're ready for our toothy smile. Draw the smile of the alligator, jumping over the two spots where the fangs cover the line. You should go all the way past the right eye. Put in the little curved line at the end of the smile. Draw in the four fangs, two facing up and two facing down. Starting under the left nostril, draw the lower jaw, curving up around the end of the smile. Go up by the eyebrow ridge of the left eye. Draw the two lines that meet up with the lower jaw line. Draw the two neck lines. Remember, NO TRACING!
